2 <u>MATTERS TO BE DISCUSSED</u>

2.1 <u>Allotments</u>

The Chair, Cllr Wetherall, welcomed the Allotment Wardens to the meeting. The Wardens reported that they had received the recent valuation carried out by Bell Watson and that they recommended the Annual Allotment Rent should be set at £35 per acre. This increase to be invoiced in April 2009. The Wardens also recommended that the piece along Beck Lane rented by Mr McCague should be increased to £50 per annum. The piece currently rented by Mr Blanchard should remain at £44 per annum. This increase reflects the quality of land available.

<u>PROPOSED</u>: CLLR S SMITH; <u>SECONDED</u>: CLLR K SMITH; <u>UNANIMOUS</u> <u>THE ABOVE RECOMMENDATIONS SHOULD BE IMPLEMENTED AND THE CURRENT TENANTS NOTIFIED</u> <u>OF DECISION</u>

The Wardens also recommended that work should be done on the dyke running by Dallison. The Wardens are to get quotes and notify the Council.

Mr Kirman and Mr Stacey were thanked for their attendance at the meeting.

- 2.2 <u>BEST KEPT VILLAGE RESULTS</u> The Chair read the list of successful villages. Unfortunately, on this occasion, Scotton were not selected for the next round.
- 2.3 <u>MOBILE LIBRARY</u> District Cllr Parry reported that the Portfolio Holder, County Cllr E Poll, would be attending Scotter PC meeting this evening at 7.30pm. One Parishioner had volunteered to attend and report any decisions made to the Council.
- 2.4 <u>PARISH CALM</u> The SID equipment will be delivered on 5th September and training will be given on that date. The Council had received the recent data from the archer. Clerk is to write to

Road Safety asking for directional data and highest speed indication.
 2.5 <u>SCUNTHORPE MCC & SUBSEQUENT TRIALS</u>
 A parishioner had raised concerns that motorbikes are using the Recreation
 Area. There were also concerns that the event on 23rd June was not properly
 marshalled and that there was a subsequent event on 2nd July for which the
 parishioner felt was not marshalled and that the motorbikes were being directed

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to the Recreation Area. The Parishioner also reported that the organiser of this event claimed that the Parish Council had given permission.

Clerk was requested to write to the organiser explaining that permission had been given to Scunthorpe MCC for 23rd June only and that no permission had ever been sought or given for an event in July. The letter to stress that permission had never been granted, for either event, for motorbike use of the Recreation Area.

2.6 <u>CLOSURE OF PAYPHONE - WESTGATE</u>

The Council agreed to reply questioning whether it would cost more to take out the kiosk than to just leave the phone as it is. As the Council do not know what the usage is it is hard to justify the retention but the Council felt that it should be retained for emergency use.

- 2.7 <u>FREE TREES FOR PARISHES</u> Mr Ramsey is going to apply for the Free Trees. One tree to replace the Memorial Tree and several hedging plants to fill gaps.
- 2.8 KERBS IN VILLAGE

Although there are several loose kerbs and also potholes, Highways have indicated that they will do their best to rectify this but it may take some time. Clerk to thank Highways for finally mending the big hole on Laughton Lane and also to ask when the faults in the village are likely to be done.
