### 2 <u>MATTERS TO BE DISCUSSED</u>

2.1 <u>MOBILE LIBRARY</u>

The Lincolnshire Federation of Women's Institutes have lodged complaints with regard to the recent provision of mobile libraries. Mrs Mary Smith, resident, has spoken to Martin Hill, portfolio holder, and has written a letter of complaint.

2.2 PARISH CALM

The provision of the Speed Indicator Device had proved useful. Several Councillors operated the device and Cllr S Smith had provided an analysis of the resulting figures. This is to be sent to Adrian Jones and Richard Greener with a request to borrow this equipment next year. The Council agreed this had proved a useful exercise and Cllr S Smith is to put an article in the newsletter.

#### 2.3 <u>MOTORBIKE TRIALS</u> The organisers dispute the fact that the event was not properly marshalled.

2.4 <u>BT Offer</u>

The Council agreed that the red phone box should be purchased for  $\pounds 1$ . Whilst they would like to keep the telephony, it was felt that  $\pounds 500$  a year was too high for a little used line.

The Council will keep the empty telephone box at a cost of  $\pounds 1$ .

2.5 <u>BUS STOP - WESTGATE</u> Council have been told that the contractors are to complete this bus stop.

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2.7 <u>Allotments</u>
